Why Choose Adrenaline Forage.

- Think of Adrenaline Forage as 'Deer Candy.' It is sweet smelling and tastes good.
- Adrenaline Forage is available in micro-nutrient coated, high-visibility blaze orange seed. It's easier to see it on the ground when planting and it provides critical nutrients needed to ensure a top-producing plot.
- It's an excellent source of carbohydrates in the fall when deer crave maximum energy sources.
- Gander Mountain's Adrenaline Forage is easy to grow and produces a heavy cover of forage that out-competes weeds in your food plot
- Adrenaline Forage will withstand heavy deer grazing.
- An excellent fall attractant that deer get 'hooked on' and keep coming back for
- Grows well in a wide variety of soil types and is easy to establish

- Easy to use—it's difficult to plant this mix incorrectly.

General Information

- Adrenaline Forage Blend is considered an annual blend, which means you can count on one growing season of forage.
- Four different types of brassicas (rape seed) are used in Adrenaline Forage for an exceptional mix deer love.
- Seed depth—1/2 to 1 inch. Never cover small seed very deep, or the young plants may not have the energy to make it to the surface.

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- pH requirements—a neutral PH of 7.0 is optimal, however, Adrenaline Forage will perform well in pH's ranging from 5.4 to 7.0.
- Seed Rate 5 lbs. of seed will cover 1/2 acre or 21,780 sq. ft.
- Wildlife attracted—Adrenaline Forage will attract mainly deer.
- If you have not done a soil test, we recommend 300-350 pounds of 10-10-10 fertilizer with pelletized lime per acre.
- When to plant—Adrenaline Forage can be planted after the last killing frost in the spring and six weeks before the first killing frost in the fall. For frost dates in your area, log onto [www.bringitonoutdoors.com](http://www.bringitonoutdoors.com) or see the end-cap display.

### Things to Consider

- Use a Gander Mountain Soil Test Kit to ensure that your soil is in top shape before you plant.
- Spray a weed killer on your food plot to eliminate competition for the plants you're trying to grow.
- Always till the soil as thoroughly as possible before you plant.
- Select a plot of land that receives adequate sunlight.
- Mowing is an important step in controlling weeds and keeping your plot tender and tasty.
- Adrenaline Forage will do well in most soil types, particularly soil that is well drained.
- An excellent general starter fertilizer is 10-10-10 with added pelletized lime.

### Frequently Asked Questions

1. Should I mow my Adrenaline Forage Plot?

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Yes, you can mow this mix if you feel the forage is getting too old or tough for the deer's tastes. Generally deer prefer younger plants, around 10-12 inches tall. However, never mow during drought- type conditions and never clip the plants too short.

### 2. Do I need to fertilize my plot each year?

You should. Adrenaline Forage will use nutrients out of the soil, so you'll need to replace them each year.

### 3. Why is it important to spray my food plot area before I plant?

Competing weed seeds that are already present in the soil usually will take over a food plot if left unchecked. It's best to spray your food plot with a herbicide that will kill competing weeds before you plant.

### 4. Is Adrenaline Forage an annual or perennial plant?

Rape seed (brassicacae) are annual plants. This means one bag of Adrenaline Forage will produce one year of forage.

### 5. Is it good to plant Adrenaline Forage (brassicacae based mix) and Management Advantage (clover based) in the same hunting area or plot?

Yes. For instance, you can plant Forage Beans in the spring and plant Adrenaline Forage in late summer on the same piece of ground. This type of management will allow you to feed maximum protein when deer need it most and maximum carbohydrates as the weather gets colder and you want to hunt.

### 6. Why doesn't Adrenaline Forage need to be pre-inoculated like the clover or alfalfa food plot mixes?

Adrenaline Forage is not a legume; therefore it doesn't need pre-inoculation as it cannot produce its own nitrogen source. We recommend Gander Mountain's Forage Enhancement Fertilizer for adding nitrogen.

### 7. Will Adrenaline Forage grow in shade?

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Adrenaline Forage will do fine in partially shaded areas, however this mix does need some sunlight in order to thrive.

8. When will the deer start eating my Adrenaline Forage?

Deer will begin eating Adrenaline Forage when the plants are 8-12 inches high. Once the plants grow past that height, your deer will return to the Adrenaline Forage plot once it freezes and the starches in the rape plants turn to sugar.
